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CEO Note:

we are extremely happy to share with you 2nd Annual Report for the year 2012-2013 has been one of perseverance and struggle in almost every area. Yet we have come through stronger and focused on improving it. We have designed more structured modules for each stakeholder to ensure their involvement in connecting education to employment. We have worked closely with parents and school staff on different issues to create conducive environments that would facilitate this process. In less than three years we have already begun to gradually hand over the program to the schools and communities to take this Bright Future initiative ahead

Compared to last year we have not expanded much but we have strengthened our planning to ensure good quality result of our deliverables. With great difficulty we have been able to sustain our team of 5 staff last year. We have designed more structured modules for each stakeholder to ensure their involvement in connecting education to employment. And this year we are proud to launch Connecting Education To Employment Modules in the name of Bright Future!

Our inputs over the previous year to 450 std IX students showed the bright Impact of the work we did. 91% of these students have taken admission in the colleges and 70% of them have chosen streams as evolved through the BF program. To enforce and ensure they continue, we have introduced Mentoring where kids interact with young professionals who keep them motivated and develop their skills related to the career they have chosen.

481 present std IX students had 95% students passing and will be appearing for their 10th exam in April 2014. These students from 5 schools and introduced them to more than 250 different careers. Around 200 parents were met and counselled through parent support groups and meetings to deal with confusion regarding their children careers and decisions related to that. NRI also took on the task to create awareness on how to deal with students in a classroom setting among 137 teachers.

In the coming year 2013-14 we are aiming to reach 4 more schools and 1200 students and their teachers and parents in addition to the 100 students in the community with a stronger and more focussed program.

All this would not have been possible without the support and well-wishes of each one connected to Bright Future especially and most importantly my TEAM and partner NGO ATMA. I would like express my respect and deep gratitude to each one who has contributed and is a part of Bright Future.

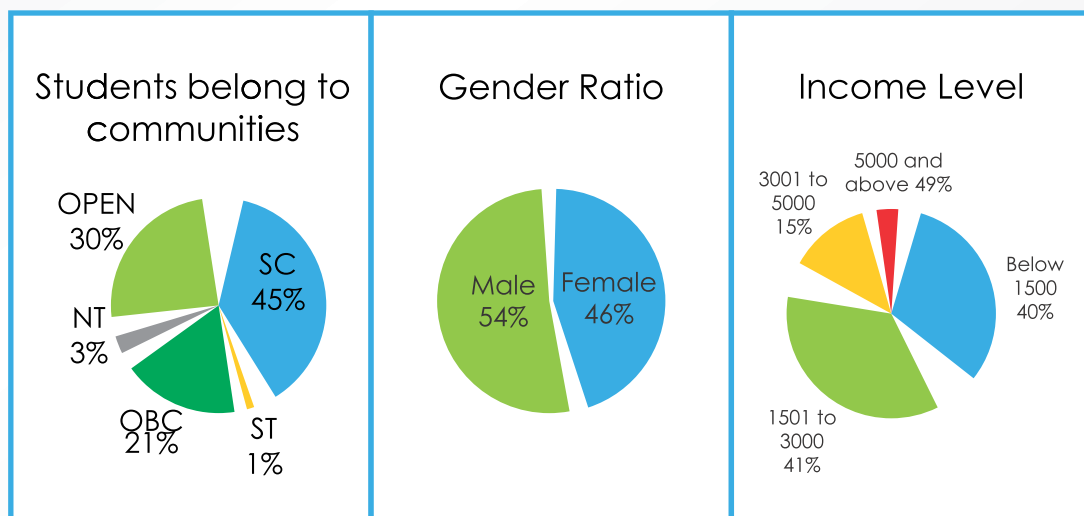

Findings:

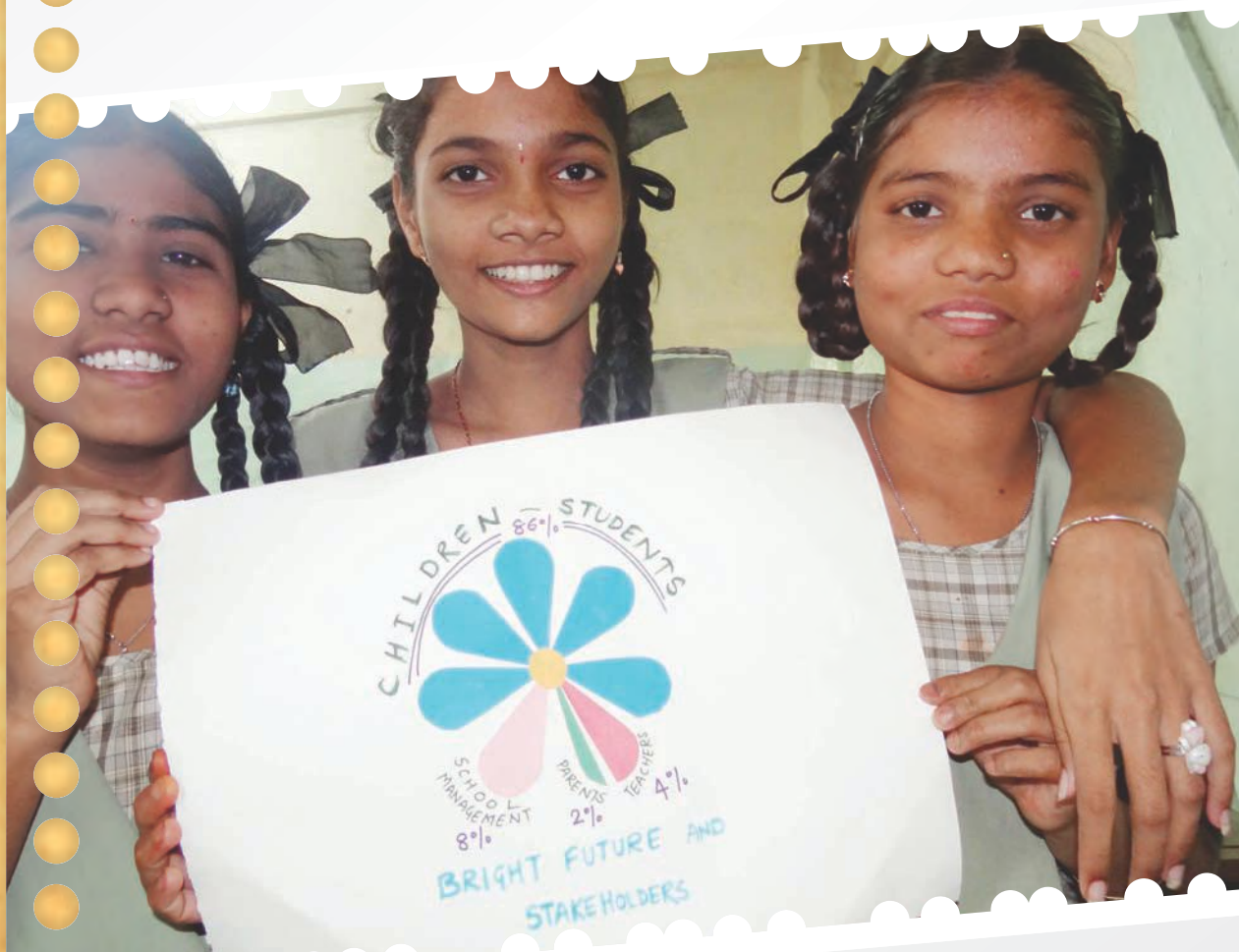
1. Out of total beneficiaries 46 % girls who was helped to set career goal

5. 90% children do not have role model in their life.

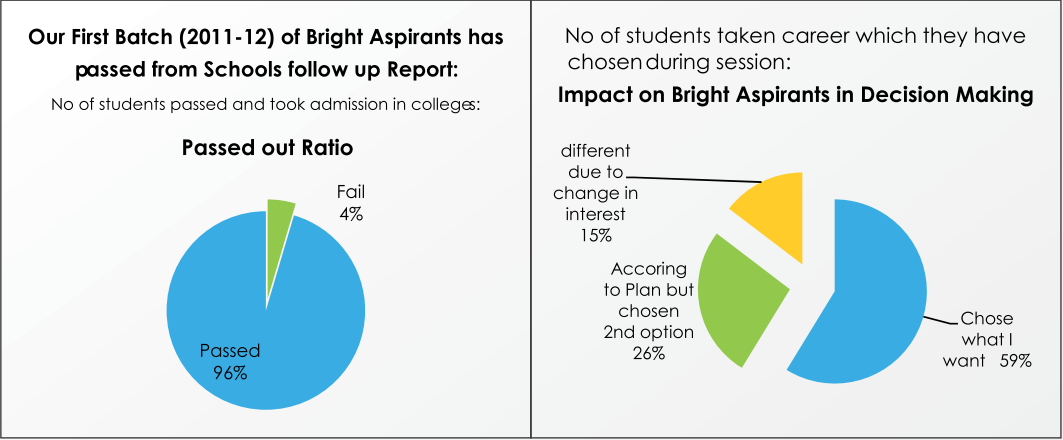
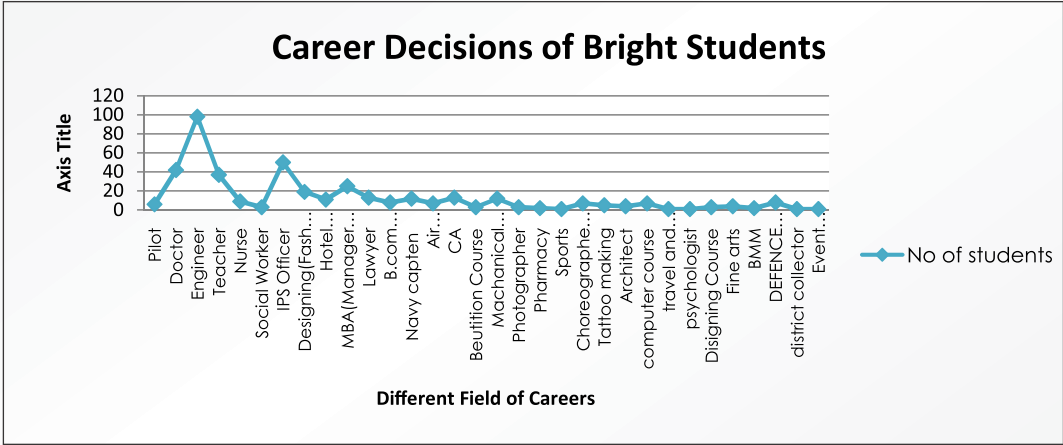
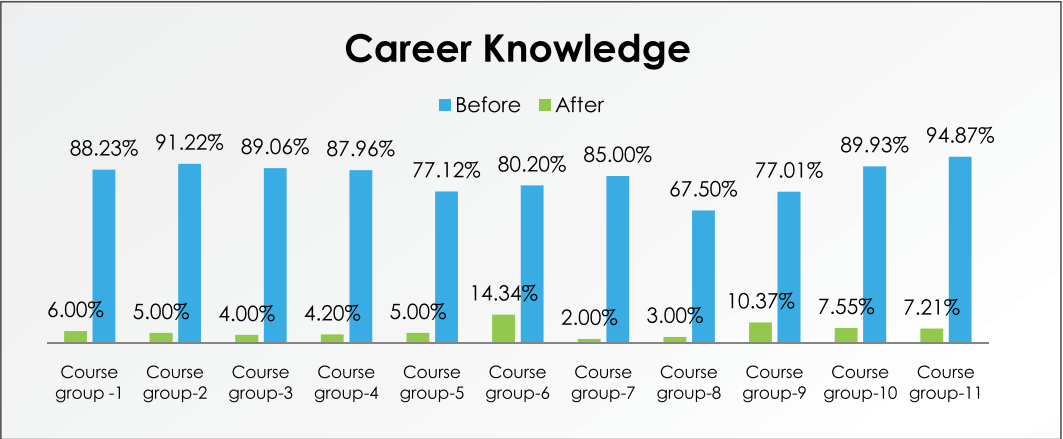
Bright School Initiative

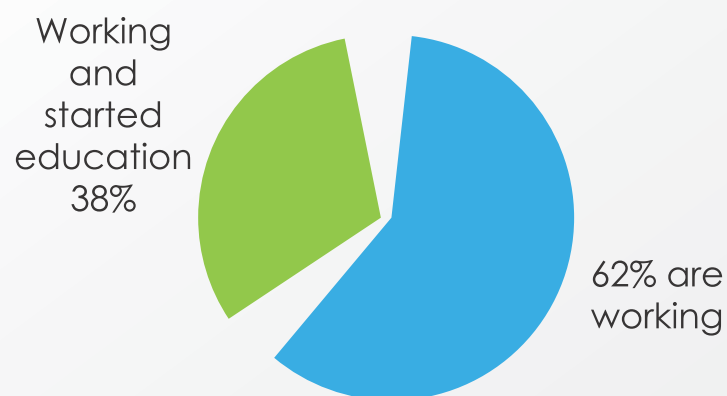


Bright Community Initiative

The program includes several day-trip "exposure visits" to various places of employment, parental workshops to ensure support for this learning from the student's family, and ends with a placement interview.

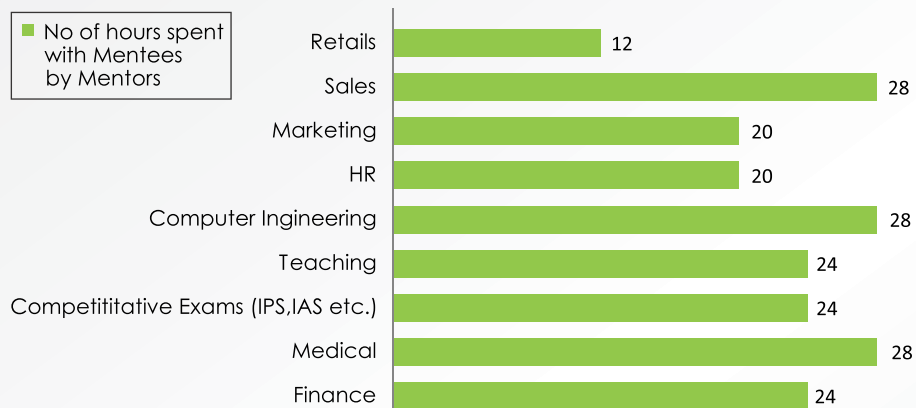
Community Impact

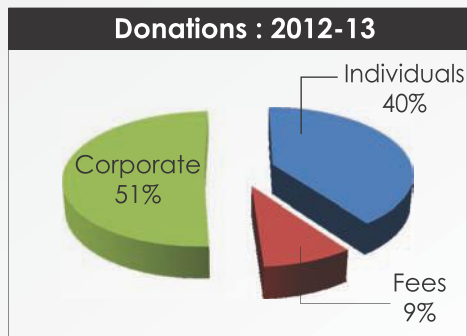
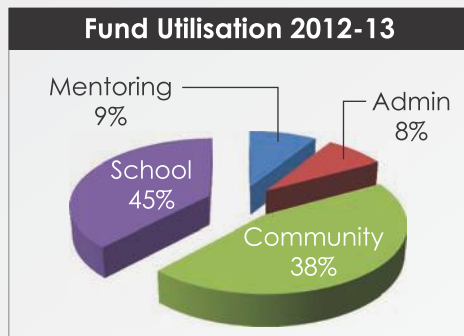
1. We have obtained all the information and explanation which to the best of my knowledge & belief were necessary for the purpose of the audit.
